Recreation Director Whitley stated he would love to hear any suggestions from the Commission.

Chair Matteo asked about the status of the relocation of the Dog Park and whether or not it would be completed by September 27th. Recreation Director Whitley stated it was doubtful but he would ask the Public Works Director.

RECREATION DIRECTOR'S ORAL REPORT

Recreation Director Whitley reported registrations for the Super Cool Summer School occurred on April 24th and 25th with nearly 500 forms. Kudos to Directors Erin Duggan and Beth Seuss. Staff is working on plans for reconfiguration of the Recreation Department.

Recreation Supervisor Clegg reported on the successful Teen/Tween programs including a trip to Disneyland, Water World, Santa Cruz Boardwalk, ice-skating, etc. She stated the Egg Hunt was a smashing success. Commissioner Blauvelt asked about the attendance. Recreation Supervisor Clegg stated there were close to 200 children in Piper Park that morning.

Chair Matteo had a question about the transportation for the Tween programs. Commissioner Blauvelt asked if most of the kids were from Hall Middle School. Recreation Supervisor Clegg stated “yes”.
